## Super Friday Mother's Day Out

This program will continue the ministry to the littlest in our homeschooling community, giving parents a well-earned break on Fridays! MDO classes will be small (12 students max) with an adult teacher and a teen aide. Classes will stay together as a group while they enjoy playtime with friends, stories, crafts, and playground time. The focus will be on sharing God's love through play while learning to have fun in a small group setting.

## Super Friday Primary

This program will cater to students beginning their homeschooling journey with fun and literature-based curriculum, age appropriate and accessible to pre-readers and early readers. SF Primary will have their own area at Super Friday that includes changing classes between three teams of teachers and aides, their own arrival and dismissal area and their OWN SNACK TIME all together as a group! Every semester will include fun group speakers and events, as well as guest demonstrations and activities from our most popular Super Friday Classic classes.

# Super Friday Classic

CLASSIC! Students choose 3 classes each semester from a crazy variety of extracurricular activities and crafts! Always wanted to learn to make art? Play chess? Grow your own food? We've got you covered! Course descriptions can be found below, with old favorites and some new classes that are going to be a blast!

## Super Friday Teen

Teens want to have a Super Friday, too! This program gives our older students a place to have fun and learn as they prepare for the world that awaits them. This semester, our teens will stay together as a group all day, but the learning, activities and fun social time will change week to week.

## Classic Program Class Options

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### **ADV Stuffie Making (D. Valdez)**

Have you mastered the regular Sewing and Stuffie Making class? Ready to work on designing your own creations? Do you want to learn additional stitches or more detailed embroidery work? This class is for you!

Basic Requirements: Have taken the basic class at least once, know the 3 basic stitches (back, satin and whip), and be able to tie on and off without help.

In this class, students may choose to use templates or design their own creations.

**ASL\* (H. Brice)** Beginning ASL will study manual alphabet, numbers, and vocabulary. We will learn how to introduce ourselves and have easy conversations. We will dive into the origins of ASL and Deaf culture. This will be a fun class so get your hands ready to start signing!

**Cheer\* (H. Brice)** Cheer Gym will focus on the fundamental skills of cheerleading. We will learn stretching, jumps, motions, cheers and dances. We will learn about projecting our voices and having a ton of spirit! Wear comfortable clothes because this will be a workout. By the end of this class I hope everyone will love cheer as much as I do. GO SUPER FRIDAY!!

### **Acting Studio\* (M. Magill) AGES 11-13 ONLY**

A new theatre class designed for students 11-13 years old who wish to take their performance skills to the next level. Students will memorize small excerpts from some of my favorite dramatic literature and rehearse and workshop their scenes in class. Every few weeks we will have new scenes to learn and work. But it's not all work...there will be lots of play too! Theatre games will be a lively start to every class to get us loose and ready for the spotlight! If the

schedule allows, we may try to showcase some of these scenes for the parents at the end of the semester. (Some stage experience is recommended but not required).

### **Beginning Games (W. Berry & A. Bryant)**

Come learn and play fun games for small groups, including classics and new favorites!

### **Chess for Boys (C. Saucedo)**

This class will show students how to move the pieces, how the game is won or lost, and basic tactics. For those who already know the basics, we will learn and build our strategies and skills through lessons and play. *Boys only.*

### **Chess for Girls (C. Saucedo)**

This class will show students how to move the pieces, how the game is won or lost, and basic tactics. For those who already know the basics, we will learn and build our strategies and skills through lessons and play. *Girls only.*

### **Conversational Spanish (M. Daly)**

The class will appeal to all learning types as we will have fun playing many engaging games, completing crafts, singing songs and role playing in addition to practicing vocabulary and pronunciation to enable them to order in a restaurant, ask for help, and carry on a short conversation. Students will need to bring a pocket folder on the first day of class. They will take home the course outline as well as vocabulary sheets each week.

### **Creating with Perler Beads (supply fee \$15) (N. Calderon)**

Join us for a semester of fun making melty bead designs. Beads are placed on a peg board, then melted with a hot iron. Don't worry, an adult will be doing all of the ironing!

We will have some set projects, some challenge projects and some themed projects (without a set pattern!)

Great projects for both boys and girls!!

### **Crochet for all Levels (E. Goodrum)**

Always wanted to crochet? Come and learn all of the basics at your own pace in a friendly environment or take your skills a step up. We will also work on some fun and easy projects!

### **Dimensional Creations (supply fee \$10)(L. Stinnett)**

Welcome to the wonderful world of 3D plastic canvas creations. This course will merge the stitches from embroidery with the art of 3D construction. It is a self-paced crafting course that includes instruction on various stitches, learning to read patterns and an introduction to assembling 3 dimensional structures. Students will create decorative and practical items (like needle holders, crosses, wall art, pumpkins, pencil holders, and Christmas ornaments). This class will start with an introduction to the basics of plastic canvas and then move into 3D designs and constructions.

\*Please consider that this class will involve a high level of fine motor skills and concentration to complete the tasks.

**Dipping into Color- supply fee \$10 (J. Hornick)**

Children will learn about the color wheel, primary, secondary and tertiary colors. They will learn mixing and creating colors, shading, shadowing and tones. Join us as we combine all these things and sprinkle in imagination to create colorful works of art!

**Drawing for All (supply fee \$10) (J. Hornick)**

Children will learn the basics of drawing in pencil and graphite, including different shading techniques, light sources, and how to place shadows for a more realistic effect. They will learn how to simplify objects, making drawing easier and more fun, while putting ideas on paper and giving their art more depth.

**Duct Tape Warfare (supply fee \$10) (K. Vasquez)**

*For students new to Duct Tape Warfare and younger students*

Come explore Medieval history and culture with us as we create Knight-style weapons out of duct tape, foam, and pvc pipe. No experience required!

**Gardening for Good (S. Andress)**

This class will introduce to the children God's plan for gardening in a fun and interactive way. The power and dominion we have been given to GROW THINGS! You can grow your own food indoors and outdoors no matter the space. Students will take home a growing kit to work on and share their progress as we learn.

**Girls Bible Study with Prayer and Journaling (class fee \$10) (S. Siu)**

Join us to study, learn, pray and encourage one another in our walk.

**Intro to Coding (B. Alder)**

Learn the basics of the JavaScript coding language while also developing critical thinking skills and creativity! We will learn everything from drawing shapes to loops, and by the end of the semester students will have the skills to create their own interactive programs and basic games. Students will need to bring a laptop with access to [khanacademy.org](https://www.khanacademy.org) every Friday.

**LEGO Innovations (G.Gilbert and J.Bosquez)**

Construct and unleash your creativity with Lego! Each week we will have a brief lesson and a Lego building challenge. During class each week, students will be able to build Lego models based on topics such as transportation, architecture, geography, history, and more! Each Lego challenge will allow the student to build his or her own creation, inspired by that week's lesson.

**Macrame (G. Pedernson and M. Estrada)(\$15)** The art of tying knots! We will master various types of knots such as a larks head knot, square knot, and an overhand knot and use them to create practical projects for everyday use. Some items might include a lanyard, mini pouch, key chain, bracelet and tote bag. Each craft item will use 2-3 weeks time to learn and complete. Attention to detail and ability to follow directions are skills you will need!

**Minute to Win It (C. Bryant)**

You have a minute...can you Win It! Get ready to shake, rattle, and roll as you compete with your classmates to win wacky challenges. This is an active class and requires no previous skills. Just a good attitude and a readiness to have fun!

**Nailed It! (supply fee \$10) (S. Curtis)**

Join us for this Pinterest inspired class where we will conquer fun crafts that you can use, wear or hang on the wall!

New projects, so we welcome repeats!

**Physical Education (S. Siu)**

Want to get your blood pumping? Feel the need to jump and shout? This class is all about fun! We will be playing lots of games and generally having a great time, while we get moving! Come have some fun with us!

**Pokemon the Card Game (supply fee \$10) (D.&N. Ramirez)**

Learn the basics of this popular game, while also learning good sportsmanship, players etiquette, arithmetic, logical/strategic thinking, reading comprehension, and socialization. *Students will receive their own deck and other game supplies, included with the supply fee.*

**Pokemon the Card Game ADVANCED (D.&N. Ramirez)**

The Pokemon TCG advance course continues what was taught in the beginning course with additional one-on-one coaching from the teacher. The student will learn advanced skills such as, deck building improvement and strategies for winning. The student should bring their own Pokemon decks as this course will not provide one. *Must have taken one semester of the beginner class and have a legal standard deck*

**Sewing, Embroidery and Stuffie Making (D. Valdez)**

Join us as we learn hand stitching, hand embroidery and machine sewing in this brand new class. Students will also get to design and make their own stuffed animals.

*Students are not required to bring a sewing machine. We will provide equipment and supplies, students may bring their own fabric choices.*

**Show-Tune Showcase (M. Magill) AGES 7-13**

Are you "Footloose" and fancy free? Were you "Born to Hand Jive"? Or maybe just want to be part of the "Greatest Show"? This song and dance class may be just for you! Our class will introduce the students to popular musical theatre show tunes. We will rehearse and stage both large and small musical numbers giving students a chance to show off their vocal talents as well as learn group choreography as we put it all together for a parent showcase at the end of the semester.

**Skit-tacular (M. Magill) AGES 8-13**

A fun theatre class which focuses on building skills through skits! Every few weeks students will form groups, create their skits, and perform them for their classmates. Skill topics we plan to

explore include pantomime, acting with props, duets, lip sync, and storytelling. This is a great intro class to build confidence on stage!

### **Speech (W. Berry)**

Join us as we build our confidence in public speaking! Speaking in front of people is one of the greatest fears many have, but if you learn early, it only becomes easier. In this class, we will go over skills for preparing and giving good speeches. You will craft speeches, give speeches, do improv speeches and help encourage others as they gain confidence in front of groups. It will be a fun class to help you grow and build a valuable life skill.

### **Sportball (class fee \$65) T. Yates**

Sportball teaches the fundamental skills of 8 different sports in a fun, stress-free, non-competitive setting. Classes keep kids moving and engaged and send them home with new skills. All equipment is provided by the Sportball coach. Sport instructions will cover basketball, soccer, t-ball, hockey, volleyball, tennis, golf, and football. *Students are welcome to take Sportball more than one time! There is so much to learn and skills will be improved each week.*

### **Strategy Board Games (W. Berry)**

Strategy Board Games is a class for students to learn and play board games. Students will work on team work, sportsmanship, and strategy. Board games are an excellent learning tool in which students don't even realize they are learning because they are having so much fun! Potential games include Settlers of Catan, Pandemic, Trekking the National Parks, 7 Wonders and Stone Age.

### **Tournament Chess (C. Saucedo)**

Take your chess game to the next level by engaging in different types of tournament play. Learn to track plays, keep score and use a timer.
